PROPOSALS FOR PPG SPENDING 2016-2017

The Pupil Premium Grant was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to support pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point within the last six years.

15% of school population receive PP funding
3% of school population attract 'enhanced' funding
6% of school population currently receive free school meals
5% of school population are 'Ever 6' (previously FSM)

CURRICULUM SUPPORT

- Quality First Teaching 8.45-9.35am Tuesdays' Literacy Shed. Y3,4,5,6 with their class teacher. Emphasis on writing and pre-learning for the week ahead
- Reflect and Perfect sessions 3-3.25pm every Thursday.

STAFFING

- Specialist teacher working 3 days a week one to one, supporting targets, providing group support, working on IEP targets where appropriate and reviewing progress on a weekly basis in consultation with class teachers and the PPG manager
- Non-teaching Pupil Premium manager will monitor pupils in Literacy and Mathematics weekly and support teachers and intervention team
- Full time TA support in FS2, Y1 and Y2 focused on pastoral support for vulnerable children and families
- A Positive Play leader in KS1 playground 4 hours each week
