School's Forum Meeting

Wonde

This is the portal online which the children use in school to access all their apps such as Times Tables Rock Stars and Education City. You are also able to access this at home, which will save children having to always use individual log-ons for apps. You will need to access <u>www.wonde.com</u> and click on the log in button in the top right-hand corner. Then you will need to find St Breock School and log in using emoji password. You will then need your child's username and emoji password which is stuck in the front of your reading record. All the children have used this regularly in school so will be familiar with it.

Parking Reminder

Please note that there is NO parent parking on site.

This is to keep children safe as they enter and leave school.

We do appreciate how limited our parking is and because of this would encourage you to walk if possible. Parking at Lidls and walking up is an option When parking around school is necessary, please, please respect our neighbours and consider how and where you are parking. Please consider when you park next to the pavement whether members of the public can safely get past without going onto the road. People who park illegally, i.e blocking driveways or on double yellow lines, run the risk of receiving a parking ticket as we have requested police presence to keep the area safe. The only instance that we allow parent parking on site in the morning is when using our DRIVE-THROUGH drop-off zone right at the front of school. This is manned by a member of staff in the morning and they will take younger children into school for you. Older children can be quickly dropped off here and enter their classrooms independently.

We have allowed parking on site in some extenuating circumstances, however this is with the understanding that cars should NOT be moved whilst there are still children on site. Please ensure you are following this rule if we have allowed you to park in our disabled or easy access spaces.

We ask that you please respect the one-way system we have in place in the mornings and after school which means the traffic flow is ONLY UP Tremarren Road not down. This has helped so much with not only traffic flow but also safety.

If other family members or friends drop off / pick up your child PLEASE remember to inform them of these procedures. Thank you.

Mobile Phones

A reminder please that children's mobile phones should be turned off and put away as soon as they enter the school premises. This is to avoid having groups of older children pouring over their phones whilst waiting outside in the morning as this can make others feel isolated and not included, as well as being unpleasant for the other parents and younger children to have to negotiate their way around. I have spoken to the Y6s particularly about this and this morning was much improved. However, I would appreciate your support in not sending un-necessary mobile phones into school and if they must come in, please re-iterate the importance of putting them away. I wish to minimise the impact of social media the children may or may not use coming into the school environment.

Parent Groups

This leads on to something discussed briefly at the School Forum, which was the impact of parent groups on social media. Whilst there are many positives to these group chats, please be aware that in the same way it can cause upset with the children, comments, reactions and actions can cause upset and anxiety in the parents and other adults in our school community. Be Kind and let's look after everyone's wellbeing.

Arbor

You will be receiving your email by the end of today from Arbor asking you to set up a log on to our new communication system. If you have not received the email please contact the office. Once you have followed the link (you may need to copy and paste this into the address bar) and set up your log on through the website on a laptop or computer NOT MOBILE DEVICE, you will then be able to download the app and log on using your mobile if you wish. Arbor will have all the same functionality as eSchools – attendance, text messages and parent consultation booking. There isn't currently a calendar function, however there will still be a calendar on our website, which will have all relevant dates. Please take a look at your details once you have logged in as you will be able to update lots of this yourself through the app.

You will no longer receive text messages through eSchools as we have run out of credits! In the meantime, any communication will be via email, Facebook and Instagram.

We hope to have everything up and running so you are able to book your consultations in for the week beginning 4th Nov.
