STAFF DEVELOPMENT

Snap shot lesson observations by the Head of School and Sports Specialist.
Training and mentoring of PE specialist apprentice to support teaching, learning and physical intervention.
Our PE Teaching and Learning Assistant allows for increased differentiation, with specialist support in lessons. This also allows us the flexibility to stream some lessons of PE. We are also able to identify and target specific physical support in the early years to ensure this does not impact on learning development. PE Assistant has a ASA L2 Qualified Teacher of swimming award, which enables us to maximise on our swimming curriculum.

TEACHING ENHANCEMENT

<p>£2500 PEPA. £1000 Aspire Our Primary PE Agreement (PEPA) across our cluster also includes subscription to YST and Arena who provide us with 5 CPD opportunities throughout the year. We lead the cluster in a programme of events (31 in 2017/18) including; the YST case study 'Our Girls Can' programme, which promotes physical activity for girls. Boys Active Day, Sportsability (SEND Activity Day), Balanceability Bikes for Early Years. The Aspire MAT (27 Schools) gives us the opportunity to work with like-minded people and continue to develop and promote PE, sport and a healthy and active lifestyle. This also increases the schools involvement in competition and events across the trust. This year we will work across the trust to develop a PE, Health and Wellbeing Charter Mark to be followed by all 27 schools. We are part of the SSAT Lead Practitioner Programme with the YST. Where we have access to a network of practitioners from across the country sharing best practice.</p> <p>TOTAL - £3500</p>	<p>IMPACT: Inclusive PE curriculum which upskills teachers and pupils. Increase in girls participation in competitive sport from 80% 2016/17 to 88% 2017/18. Improved attitude towards PE and Sport. 32 children Y1-3 attending new after school bike club. Working in partnership to increase participation and success in competition. Increase in the numbers of pupils participating in competitive opportunities against other schools went from 84% 2016/17 to 88% 2017/18. A variety of CPD opportunities for teaching staff, teaching assistants and lunch time supervisors to enhance teaching, learning and activity across the school.</p>

<p>£1500 BM CPD Training of PE apprentice to attain Level 5 apprenticeship to become a Primary School Physical Education Specialist. This will enhance lesson delivery through quality first teaching and team teaching with other staff.</p> <p>£1000 Development of after school clubs Improving the quality of our after school clubs and ensuring a clear link to community clubs available to our children.</p> <p>£2770 FMS implementation, screening and training.</p> <p>£450 KS1 app implementation and set up. Continue to work on the movement screening app in KS1 and screening in KS2 in response to the changing environment for children today and how we combat the 'ipad generation'. With obesity, mental health and muscular skeletal injuries increasing NHS costs, it is our responsibility to ensure funding given by the government combats the rise of these issues in primary school children. In KS2 FMS is a tool that allows us to understand each child's unique system and how they are able to receive information and transfer that to movement. Intervention will then seek to prevent their muscular and/or cognitive health from slipping. This is ground breaking work and will only be working with Aspire Schools in the UK. We are working closely with the UK leader in this field and he is completing his own research which seeks to present a case study of the links between cognitive health and muscular skeletal health. We will also be purchasing and putting staff through the training for a screening app in KS1 to run alongside FMS.</p> <p>£4860 Minibus lease (50% of annual cost) The leasing of two Minibuses has removed the limits and costs that transport has proved to be for sporting fixtures and events.</p> <p>£500 Top up Swimming At St Breock our aim is to have the majority of our children swimming 100m by the time they leave Y6. All year groups swim for a term but those who are are non-swimmers in Y2 and above continue to swim all year until they can swim a width confidently on front and back. We use our PE and Sport grant to subsidise this for parents.</p> <p>£1000 Equipment update and refresh This ensures the children have a variety of high quality equipment available to enhance lessons and a broad range of sports and activities are on offer.</p> <p>TOTAL £12,080</p>	<p>Fluency, consistency and broad curriculum coverage achieved through delivery of a comprehensive, high quality PE curriculum. New Balanceability club set up to engage children who previously did not engage with after school clubs. 18% increase in attendance of KS2 after school clubs Coaches used as role models to target pupil groups. More children encouraged to attend after school clubs. Annual Community Sports Awards Evening attended by local clubs and the school community, where children's participation in community sports is celebrated. Children understand the principles of muscular skeletal health and how this impacts on their readiness for learning. Classrooms offer opportunities for children to be active throughout the day rather than sedentary. Increase in alertness, attention and readiness for learning.</p> <p>The minibus has been used for 41 sporting events this year. It has enabled us to attend 4 new sport events this year; orienteering, Cornwall school games sailing, Cornwall school games football and country primary schools hockey festival. Increase in the breadth of our curriculum due to curriculum time being spent using local facilities for; surfing, bowls, mountain biking and outdoor learning. Last year 100% of our Y6s left us swimming 25 metres. In 2016/17 -12 non-swimmers. 2017/18 – 3.</p>
