Mary Anning's Dinosaurs & Other Traditional Tales

The Autumn term has been split into two main topics which will be used as a way of linking all the subjects in the curriculum. In Autumn 1 we will be travelling back over 65 million years to discover the land of the dinosaurs while in in Autumn 2 we will be studying both fictious and historical traditional tales.

Literacy

The children will be using Tyrannosaurus Drip by Julia Donaldson and a selection of traditional tales to enhance their reading and writing skills. Children will be given the opportunity to develop their reading comprehension skills through predicting events within stories, discussing word meanings and applying their phonetical knoweledge to read independently. They will also begin to form simple sentences from memory, dictation and independently with the correct punctuation. The children will be encouraged to form all letters in the cursive style and to think carefully about orally sounding out words when spelling. Often they will also be given the chance to develop their creative writing skills and will produce work from a variety of genres including: recipes, letters and articles.

Throughout both terms the children will receive daily Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling type sessions which will help them to develop their skills in their written work. Primarily this term we will be continuing to focus on the ingredients for a perfect sentence: capital letters, full stops and finger spaces and encouraging the children to use these independently. This will take place alongside weekly reading comprehension tasks and activities.

Mathematics

The theme for mathematics this term is 'Number' and the children will be working on building their confidence handling numbers to 10 and then to 20. We will be specifically looking at place value, counting forwards and backs from numbers to 20 (from 0 and any number), identifying one more and one less and number bonds. Once the children are confident in this area, we will be moving on to use these skills to tackle arithmetic style addition and subtraction questions and some basic problem solving, Towards the end of Autumn 2 we will also look briefly at Geometry and the children will explore the differences between 1D, 2D and 3D shapes. They will be able to sort these shapes into different groups based purely on their characteristics.

Music

This term the children will be learning a range of singing games and activities which will enhance their skills with rhythm and pitch.

Science

This subject is split into two main focus areas this term. The children will start the term by looking at the seasons before moving on to materials. In both areas they will developing their skills to work scientifically, making observations and predictions whilst ensuring all experiments are conducted fairly and accurately alongside sorting data in a variety of ways.

Computing

This term the children will enhance their programming skills by studying and gaining an understanding of algorithms. They will be playing a range of games to interpret and follow instructions before designing their own examples. They will also be using technology to purposefully create and organise digital content.

History

The children will be given the opportunity to enhance their awareness of the past through studying Mary Anning's England and The Great Fire of London. They will be encouraged to discuss, answer and ask questions using accurate vocabulary and be able to fit key events from these periods in chronological order.

Geography

Children will be working upon their map and fieldwork skills this term. They will be use simple compass directions and directional language to describe locations and routes on maps. They will also study landmarks in order to create their own maps of the local environment.

Art

Children will study a range of artists and materials in order to influence their own artwork. They will develop skills with colour mixing, paint and fabric.

Design and Technology

The children will enhance their knowledge of materials in DT to design, make and evaluate both food products and structures.

PSHE

Our PSHE and British Values lessons are encompassed by Jigsaw and in this subject the children will exploring 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Difference'. Within these sessions the children will celebrating the ways in which we are all unique and special and accepting the freedoms and choices we have in everyday life.

PΕ

The children will be developing their functional movement, aesthetic movement and manipulation skills. They will be celebrating how to be healthy both in mind and body and will be given the opportunity to strengthen relationships in a variety of team and partner-based activities.

Religious Education

Children will be using their investigation skills to learn about Hinduism. They will research what it means to be a Hindu and how certain festivals are celebrated. Towards the end of the term we will also study the Christian creation story and the celebration of Christmas.





Autumn Term

The science themes for this term are 'Earth and Space', including looking at the solar system and the effect the sun and moon have on our lives, and 'Forces', looking at gravity and the best way to travel on land and water.

Our literacy topics this term are UFO sightings and hoaxes and The Jungle Book and Just So Stories. In geography and history, we will be looking at the invasions of the Anglo Saxons and Hitler and the impact on the United Kingdom.

Literacy

- Grammar Clauses, commas, expanded noun phrases, adverbials to link ideas across paragraphs, parenthesis using commas, speech punctuation, relative clauses and pronouns.
- Spelling Words with the letter string 'ough' and with 'silent' letters, words ending in '-able' and '-ible', homophones, plurals and patterns and strategies to help learn new words, from the Year 5/6 word list.
- Recounts, oral presentations, character descriptions and humourous stories.
- Reading comprehensions and guided reading.

Numeracy

Number - How to compare, order and round numbers to 1,000,000. Multiply and divide by 10, 100, 1000 and use negative numbers. Add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits. Use factors, multiples, square and cubed numbers.

Measurement - Measure and calculate perimeter and area.

Statistics - To read and interpret line graphs and timetables.

Science

To describe: the movement of the Earth and other planets in the solar system relative to the sun; the movement of the Moon relative to the

Earth. To explain day and night using the idea of the Earth's rotation and relate this to the Earth's apparent movement across the sky.

To explain the impact of gravity on our lives. To identify and explain: the effects of air resistance; the effects of water resistance; the effects of friction. To explain how levers can allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

Computing – Children will be given a refresher on e-safety, learn how to use and manipulate PowerPoint for their own presentation, word process their own composition and write and debug their own coding algorithms.

Geography/History – Anglo Saxons – invasion, settlement, kingdoms, art and culture. WWII – the impact, chronology and geography of Hitler's invasion of Europe.

Art – L.S. Lowry and the concept of perspective.

DT – Researching, planning, testing, cooking and evaluating healthy options for our Christmas party.

PE – This term we will be covering the skills required for passing and moving, attacking and defending through various team sports.

RE

- Judaism The Jewish belief in God, how this is shown, the importance of repentance and forgiveness and the value of gratitude.
- Christianity We are investigating the Christmas story, how it relates to the Bible and documenting what we find out.

Music - Brass, Sing Up.

French – Greetings, shopping, directions and finding places.

PSHE

- Jigsaw 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Difference'.
- British Fundamental Values 'Mutual Respect' and 'Rule of Law'.

YEAR 6 AUTUMN TERM 2019

MRS HAWKINS AND MRS MOINE

Autumn Term

Our theme this term is all about the Victorian Age. Children will demonstrate knowledge and understanding about the everyday lives of children in the Victorian period; show how some aspects of the period have been interpreted in different ways; select and combine information from a range of textbooks, documentary source and communicate their knowledge and understanding of changes to children's lives in Victorian times in organised and structured ways.

Literacy Children will:

- Use a colon to introduce a list,
- Discuss and use ideas for diary writing.
- Develop understanding of parentheses using brackets; dashes or commas.
- Write and compose dialogue between characters.
- Discuss the historical content in the book 'War Horse'.
- Recognise the features of a performance poem.
- Explore the use of onomatopoeic words.
- Discuss possible fairy tales to use in poems.
- Identify and define the key features of non-chronological reports.
- Plan and write a diary extract as a character from Oliver Twist.
- Write up a set of instructions.

Numeracy Children will:

- Read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 10,000,000 and determine the value of each digit.
- Interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative numbers through to zero.
- Round any given number to a required degree of accuracy.
- Solve number and practical problems that involve all the above
- Solve addition and subtractions multi step problems in context, deciding which
 operations and methods to use.
- Multiply multi-digit number up to 4 digits by a 2-digit number using the written formal method of long multiplication.
- Divide numbers up to a 2- digit whole number.
- Identify common factor, common multiples and prime numbers.
- Solve problems involving the four operations.
- Use estimation to check answers to calculations and determine in the context of a problem.

Science

Throughout this term children will focus on developing their knowledge and understanding of light, evolution and inheritance. They will plan and carry out many investigations in response to given enquiry questions and demonstrate and descried the movement of light. Children will report and present findings from their enquiries and identify variables that need to be controlled to achieve a fair test.

ICT - E safety, multimedia, word processing and digital media.

Art - Create an accurate portrait sketch of Queen Victoria in the style of Van Gogh. Learn about the famous artist Van Gogh. Explore the use of coloured textures choosing colour for purpose.

DT - Children will design and make clothes for a Victorian peg doll Communicate ideas through detailed labelled drawings.

Plan and order work, choosing appropriate materials, tools and techniques.

Pin and stitch materials together to create a product.

Evaluate product against original product identifying strengths and areas for development,

Topic - The Victorians

Use appropriate terminology and methods to present information about the past Extend and deepen chronological knowledge and understanding of British, local and world history.

Describe the ideas, political power, industry and empire Britain 1837-1901 Conduct a local study.

PE - This term children will be learning these skills through team sports.
