Year 1 Autumn 2025



This term, our Year 1 class will be exploring the exciting theme of Transport. We will delve into how transportation has evolved over time and the significant impact it has had on our lives. Focusing on the remarkable story of the Wright Brothers, who achieved the first successful man-powered flight. We will learn about their journey, the challenges they faced and how their groundbreaking invention transformed the world of travel.

Literacy

This term in literacy, Year 1 will explore labels, lists and captions to help describe and organise ideas. Later in the term, we will move on to a unit about letters and postcards, using the book Dear Father Christmas for inspiration before writing our own letters to Santa. Throughout all lessons we will be focussing on different elements of grammar such as: punctuation, verbs, nouns and building single clause sentences.



HOME CHALLENGE

For home learning, children can either create a presentation about their favourite mode of transport or how they like to travel.

Alternatively, they can build a junk model of their chosen transport using recycled materials.

Details of when to complete this by will be given towards the end of term.

Mathematics

This term in Maths, Year 1 will focus on place value, counting, comparing numbers, and basic addition and subtraction, building a strong foundation in number sense and problem-solving skills.

Spellings

We will be using spelling shed to learn weekly spellings. These spellings will include: words containing each of the 40+ phonemes already taught and common exception words.

Science

This term in Science, Year 1 will study animals, learning about their diets, body parts, and senses, along with basic human biology.



Foundation Subjects

History: Study the Wright brothers' flight experiments and build simple models to understand aviation basics.

Design & Technology: Explore mechanisms such as wheels and axles to build a vehicle. Geography: Map local landmarks such are our park and develop basic map-reading skills.

Art: Practice using line, colour, and mixed media in creative art projects.

Computing: Learn essential computer skills, including typing and using basic software. Personal Development: Focus on classroom rules, safety, and building positive friendships.

RE: Explore creation stories and religious narratives from various cultures.

PE: Participate in physical activities and games to enhance coordination and fitness.

Music: Learn how to perform the 'Menu Song'.
