Literacy

In our literacy lessons this term we will begin with an in depth focus on all Year Four grammar areas including nouns, verbs and subjects. We will then be looking at narrative writing, newspaper reports and poetry in the lead up to Christmas.



Maths

In our maths lessons this term, we will begin by focusing on place value. We will then move on to addition and subtraction and finally finish the term exploring multiplication and division.

Science

In science we will be investigating what happens to the food that we eat. We then move on to investigating whether materials can change state.



This term we will be continuing to make our way through the LKS2 statutory spellings. The children's spellings will be given to them on a Wednesday for them to stick into their jotters. The spellings are also set on Spelling Shed each week for the children to use to practise.

Foundation Subjects

Geography: Looking at Europe as a whole with focus on Italy and its physical features. We will also cover earthquakes and volcanos.

History: How we know so much about Ancient Greece and how can we work out what their everyday life was like.

D and T: Designing, making and evaluating a book sleeve.

Art: Explore how we can create sequenced imagery to share and tell stories.

French: Pets, home life and describing ourselves.

Personal Development: Exploring 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Differences'.

RE: How are why do people mark the significant events of life? What is the 'Trinity' and why is it important for Christians?

PE: Developing skills: passing, moving, creating space and dribbling through a variety of sports.

Computing: The internet, websites and webpages; audio editing and podcasts. **Music:** Sing a broad range of unison songs with a range of octave. Listen to recorded and live performances from a range of contexts.
