


# Reading in EYFS at St Breock

Reading is fundamental to education. Proficiency in reading, writing and spoken language is vital for pupils' success. Through these, they develop communication skills for education and for working with others: in school, in training and at work.

The Reading Framework, DfE July 2023



Your child's reading journey at St Breock starts the minute they join us.



We immerse the children in the world of books. Our classrooms have cosy reading corners filled with carefully selected books. Adults read high quality stories, poems and rhymes on several occasions every single day.

In our Nursery, we focus on developing children's speaking and listening skills, which are crucial for learning to read and write.



We explore sounds though activities like recognising environmental and instrumental sounds, alliteration, rhythm and rhyme and voice sounds.

We attune children to the sounds of language before they connect them to letters.


In the summer term in Nursery, we focus on oral blending and segmenting.



We introduce the children to Fred. Fred is a frog who can only speak in sounds (s-a-t). We call this Fred Talk.

We play lots of games with Fred to develop the children's oral blending and segmenting skills.

In Reception we move on to teaching the children how to link the sounds of spoken language (phonemes) with written letters or groups of letters (graphemes).



We teach the children to read by sounding out words. This teaching method is called phonics.

At St Breock, we have chosen to follow a high quality, government accredited phonics programme in order to give your children the best phonics teaching.








Our phonics programme is called Read, Write Inc (RWI) and we follow it very precisely. We have a team of well trained, expert reading teachers and phonics is taught to a very high standard. We have a shared ethos at St Breock that all children can be taught to read.

#### So, how do we teach phonics?

Phonics is taught daily as a priority. Sessions begin right from the start of Reception and children work their way through the programme until they have completed it by the end of Year 2.






What can you do at home to support your child with reading?

#### How often should your child practice?




As often as possible! Just a few minutes every day will really help to develop these skills.
