



# Reading in KS1 at St Breock







### How do we teach reading in KS1?




















First and foremost, we read to the children. Teachers read high quality stories, poems and non-fiction texts every single day. Our classrooms promote a reading for pleasure culture with cosy book corners filled with carefully selected books.

We continue to teach your children phonics. At St Breock, we have chosen to follow a high quality, government accredited phonics programme in order to give your children the best phonics teaching and learn the skills for reading.







Our phonics programme is called Read, Write Inc (RWI) and we follow it very precisely. We have a team of well trained, expert reading teachers and phonics is taught to a very high standard. We have a shared ethos at St Breock that all children can be taught to read.

Your child's phonics journey at St Breock is now well under way.

All children learn at different rates, so we put them into phonics groups that suit their reading ability.




The children are assessed every half term which enables us to regroup as necessary.

For children who are at risk from falling behind their peers, we have regular one-to-one phonics interventions in place with a Read, Write Inc trained adult in school.



In the summer term of Year One, all children will sit the government's Phonics Screening Check.




Every child will be asked to read a list of 40 real nonsense phonically decodable words. The check assesses their sound knowledge, and their final score will determine if they have passed the check.

So, what can you do at home to support your child with reading?

Reading is a skill that requires lots of practice. We will be sending home the following resources to support you with this.

Children will bring home a paper copy of the book they have been reading in their phonics lessons as well as another unseen book, linked to the phonics book.






The reading books will be changed after three days, in line with our phonics sessions in school.

How often should your child read to you?




As often as possible! Just a few minutes every day will really help to develop these skills.
