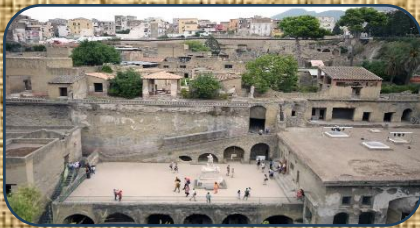

English

This term in Literacy, we will focus on a range of engaging text types, including narratives that develop character through speech. We will also write a persuasive letter inspired by Boudicca, and record a science experiment using clear, structured language.



Maths

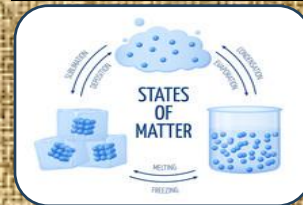
This term in Maths, we will develop understanding of decimals, money and time, as well as shape, statistics, and position and direction.

Science

In science we will be investigating States of Matter. We will then move on to learning about Sound and Electricity.

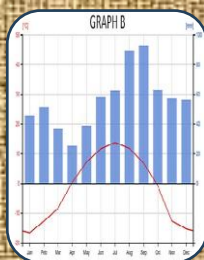
Spellings

This term, we will follow the Grammarsaurus spelling programme, with daily spelling practice in school. Pupils will focus on key spelling patterns and rules, including prefixes, suffixes, word stems, and spelling investigations (e.g. inter-, -ed, -hood, -ship, struct, spect, aud, phone, matric), with buffer weeks built in to support consolidation.



Home Challenge

Using what the children have learnt this term as a starting point, we are challenging them to create something to share with the class. This could be a poem, story, presentation, a dance, a song, in fact, it could be in any format they like! Please can their presentations be in school on the 22.06.26. We look forward to seeing all the children's amazing work!



Foundation Subjects

- Geography:** We will learn about coastal erosion. We will then study weather and climate, completing a fieldwork unit.
- History:** Our Geography learning links to History by exploring how past communities were affected by weather events and coastal change.
- D&T:** Pupils will design, make, and evaluate a healthy food product, preparing it safely and choosing ingredients for flavour, texture, and nutrition.
- Art:** Pupils will explore drawing and working in three dimensions, developing sculpture ideas in their sketchbooks.
- French:** Pupils will learn vocabulary and simple phrases linked to playing an instrument, the weather, and fruits.
- Personal Development:** Pupils will learn about healthy relationships, emotions, and the changes that happen as we grow, helping them to develop confidence, respect, and self-understanding.
- RE:** Pupils will explore what it means to be a Hindu in Britain today and how people in Cornwall mark significant events in community life.
- PE: Developing skills:** throwing, catching, batting, bowling, and fielding through cricket activities
- Computing:** Pupils will learn programming skills by using repetition to create shapes and develop simple games.
- Music:** Pupils will learn to play the flute through Enchanted Forest, developing rhythm, breath control and note reading before performing together as a group.
