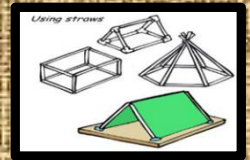

Foundation Subjects

Geography: Pupils will learn about their region and the Western United States. Pupils will explore the geography of North America and the USA, the physical geography in the Western United States and how it compares to our region along with the human geography of both areas.

D&T: Pupils will design, make, and evaluate a frame structure, using appropriate tools to accurately measure, mark out, cut, shape and join construction materials to make frameworks.

Art: Pupils will explore the Shoreditch Sketcher (Phil Dean) drawing and working in three dimensions, developing ideas in their sketchbooks to make an architectural model.

French: Pupils will learn vocabulary and simple phrases linked to counting to 100, money, the supermarket and naming various foods.

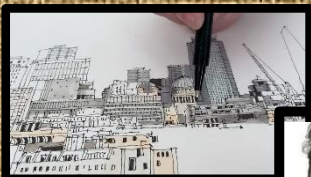
Personal Development: Pupils will learn about healthy relationships, emotions, and the changes that happen as we grow, helping them to develop confidence, respect, and self-understanding.

RE: Pupils will explore how following God can bring freedom and justice for Christians and what matters most to Humanists and Christians.

PE: Summer sports and preparing for sports day.

Computing: Pupils will learn about devices and apps that record audio and video and identify tasks that are managed by computer systems and explain the benefits.

Music: Pupils will learn about the history of music, create, notate, and perform an interlocking rhythm over 8-beat patterns and sing and play the notes (Swar) of the Indian Classical scale.
