

# Music development plan summary: St Breock School

At St Breock, music plays an integral role in inspiring children to develop a love of music, enabling them to deepen their self- confidence, creativity and movement.

We aim for pupils to;

- Sing to develop pitch, harmony and musical development.
- Listen to develop musical understanding and expand their musical horizons to many cultures and traditions.
- Compose as a creative process and development of musical memory.
- Perform to celebrate, collaborate, share and experience music as a stage-craft.

This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

## Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Pupils are taught music weekly using well-chosen units from the Sing Up curriculum. In addition music is incorporated across the school within daily routines and songs, break times, assemblies, curricular links and performances.

Our music offer:

- Our school curriculum is informed by the National Curriculum, this is delivered using units from the Sing Up scheme of work.
- Example opportunities for pupils to learn to play an instrument, perform and sing are enabled through; school choir, school performances, school assemblies, Cornwall Music Service and Cornwall Youth Choir.
- St Breock and the music lead work in partnership with ASONE Music Hub, Cornwall Music Trust, Cornwall Youth Choir and Aspire Music Network/Hub schools sharing instruments and resources.

All pupils access quality WAVE one music teaching, pupils with special educational need (SEND) are supported in the following way;

- A safe space which encourages open discussion on the concepts being taught and provides the environment needed to take new risks for new learning.
- The use of digital floor books to evidence learning and encourage participation from all student. In this way children who may not flourish in some areas of the curriculum feel secure to vocalise their learning during practical aspects of the lesson, demonstrating good understanding in a way they would otherwise not be able to do.
- Adult support as needed.
- Work scaffolded based on the needs of the children so it is accessible to their individual needs.
- Adapted tools and equipment.

## **Part B: Extra-curricular music**

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At St Stephen Churchtown pupils are able to access Co-Curricular opportunities: Choir, Drama, Rocksteady, Cornwall Youth Choirs and Cornwall Music Service Trust.

At St Breock pupils are able to access extra-curricular opportunities through; choir, drama and Cornwall Music Service Trust.

Pupils are able to access a weekly choir club, a KS2 drama club and small group instrument and singing support. These clubs are open to all KS2 pupils free of charge.

## Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

At St Breock pupils are offered a variety of musical opportunities; pupils are able to choose to get involved through clubs or are given the opportunity through arranged experiences this maybe through participation or in the audience.

Musical experiences are:

- Nine Lessons and Carols Service at St Breock Church led by Y5 & Y6 pupils
- Nativity performance for EYFS including nursery.
- Keys stage 1 Christmas performance
- Y3 & Y4 Christmas performance
- Y6 End of year performance
- Choir Performance for parents
- Song Fest performance
- Open afternoon performances at end of term for all classes
- Sharing assembly performances
- Watching pantomime performance

## In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

In the next academic year at St Breock School's focus will be applied to developing the following areas;

- Monitor and evaluate the teaching of music to effectively building upon good practice, recording and assessment.
- Continue to liaise with Music Hub to implement the teaching of a musical instrument to Y4 children
- Develop the school choir establishing pupils and encouraging new pupils from Year 3 and 4.
- Develop music in assemblies linking with school values
- Develop career links for pupils
- Develop performance opportunities in school and in the wider Trust ensuring all pupils access opportunity for music celebration and performance
