Interventions to support children with gross and fine motor movement – Early Writing Engagement Programme/Physical intervention programme. Investment in outdoor provision to encourage physical activity, particularly climbing and balancing. Employment of external coach to support interventions in KS1 to increase fundamental movement skills, to increase physical development and access to physical activity in the curriculum and beyond. Physical active activity non-negotiable start to the day – Wake & Shake, Super Movers combine with times tables practice. Consistency of practice in Writing and Maths across both key stages to include use of regular activity. Use of Teach Active Resource to support and face to face training. Use Sensory Circuit resource in school for increased physical activity Active breaks to be used effectively across the school. Sport For All - timetabled streamed physical activity across whole school on a Friday pm. throughout the school day and for self-regulation.
