Mathematics

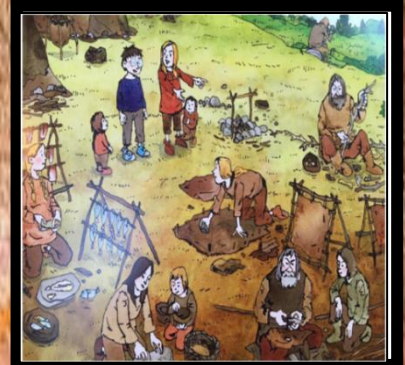
Within our Mathematics sessions we will begin our work on Addition & Subtraction before developing our skills solving problems involving Multiplication & Division.

Art: Create dramatic prehistoric-inspired charcoal drawings inspired by Laura McKendry

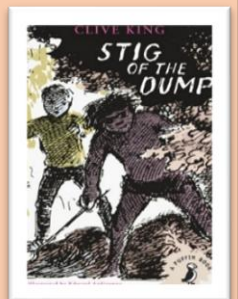
French: Greetings and Names, Numbers to 20
