

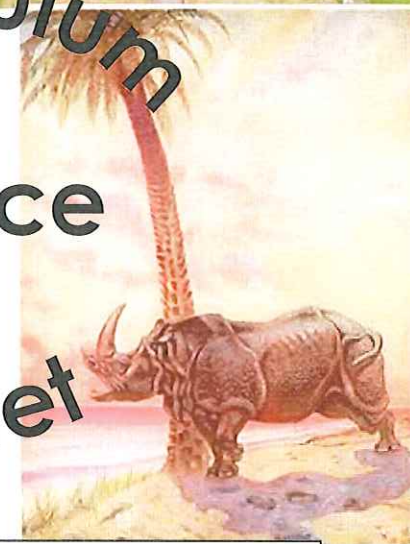
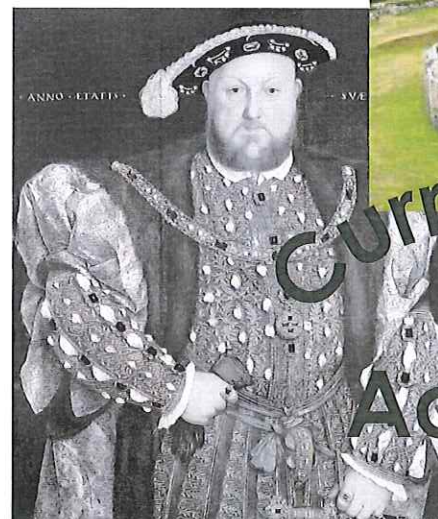
Home Challenges

Spring Term 2022

Spring Term

We will be exploring the Tudors this term; their way of life, exploration and most famous monarch, Henry VIII. The science theme for this term is 'Properties and changes of materials', including looking at materials suitable for food preparation, thermal insulation and food packaging.

Literacy

- Grammar – modal verbs, time adverbials, expanded noun phrases, brackets, commas, hyphens, suffixes and pronouns.
- Spelling – words ending in 'able', adverbs of time, suffixes, silent letters, words with 'ie' after 'c', words using 'ough'.
- Creation Myths, biographies, limericks, and choral poetry.
- Reading comprehensions.

Numeracy

Number

- Multiplying and dividing both mentally and using written methods
 - Multiplying 4-digits by 2-digits
 - Divide 4-digits by 1-digit
 - Divide with remainders

Fractions

- Equivalent fractions
- Improper fractions to mixed numbers
- Compare and order fractions
- Adding and subtracting fractions
- Multiplying fractions by a whole number

Science – We will learn about different materials, their uses and their properties, as well as dissolving, separating mixtures and irreversible changes. We will have the chance to find the best electrical conductor and will find out about different ways to separate mixtures of materials, using filtering, sieving and evaporating. Finally, we will learn about irreversible changes.

Computing – Digital Literacy, staying safe online, using documents to edit, improve and correct written work and combining a variety of software to create one finished piece of work.

Art/DT – We'll learn about the sculptor Henry Moore and explore the techniques of clay sculpting, then we'll investigate ways to create a robust 3D structure and recreate an architectural element of a Tudor castle.

PE – Game playing skills, dance and gymnastics.

RE

- Being a Christian – GOD: What does it mean if God is Holy and Loving?
