Spring Term

We will be learning about the American Revolution this term; the reasons for the conflict, the events and the key people involved. We will also look at the geography of the first colonies in America and their way of life. The science themes for this term are 'Living things and their habitats' and 'Animals and humans', including looking at different lifecycles.

Science – We will learn about reproduction in flowering plants, asexual reproduction in plants, insect, amphibian, mammalian and bird life cycles and how natural scientists explore and document the world. We will then move on to the human lifecycle, learning and researching growth, development, puberty and old age.

Computing – E-safety, animation, creating, editing and manipulating filmed work and using 'Green screen'.

Art/DT – We'll Illustrate an element of the American Revolution, learning about how to mix paint for hue, tint, tone, shades and mode. We'll also recreate a British Infantry haversack, as used by the soldiers in the American Revolution.

PE – Bowls, swimming, cricket and tennis.

Music – Working towards a class performance of Yankee Doodle using different ostinato, melody and harmony lines. Learning about rhythm notation, leading on to written music notation. Call and response work, composing their own calls, listening and singing.
